#### 2024 KC Scholarship Program

The Knights of Columbus in Thief River Falls is offering four \$500 educational assistance scholarships for students currently attending an institution of higher education. ## Distribution of the Precious Blood

During the Sacred Holy Triduum, Holy Communion will be distributed under both kinds: the Consecrated Host and the Chalice. This is particularly fitting on Holy Thursday in commemoration of the Institution of the Eucharist, at the Easter Vigil when new Catholics receive Holy Communion for the first time, and on Easter Sunday, in celebration of the bodily Resurrection of Christ. The constant teaching of the Church still remains: the Real Presence of Christ, Body and Blood, is fully present in the Consecrated Host and is also fully present in the Chalice. A person does not receive less of Christ should they choose to receive only the Host or only from the Chalice, nor do they receive more if they choose to receive both kinds during Holy Communion.


#### FINAL THOUGHTS
