# From the Desk of Fr. Vasek


#### Greetings,

It is a great delight to announce that we will be able to use our new entrance starting with Christmas eve Mass! Do not expect the space to look or feel finished at all, but it will be passable. See the note in the bulletin about which door to use, when it's open, etc., but I'm simply delighted to share the news. And the restored bell is up and will be running, ringing in Holy Mass beginning with Christmas Eve. The church bell, among other things, announces to the city that the Lord is among us, especially around the time of Holy Mass. These two announcements bring us joy and encouragement, to see the building project coming along. As a reminder, the interior of the new entrance is not due to be completely finished until right around Easter Time.

We were able to give assistance to 20 families with the gifts and food provided through the Giving Tree ministry. I'm very grateful to everyone who was able to participate in this work of charity and Christian solidarity.

I hope that you are able to experience this coming week as a truly joyful week of preparation for the warmest of all celebrations, the annual commemoration of the Nativity of Our Lord. Advent is usually 4 weeks long – this year it is barely 3. Recommendation: spend a little bit of time each day with one of the 7 "O Antiphons," those beautiful Old Testament prophecies shedding light on the Lord who is to come.

The St. Bernard's Adoration Society desires for our parish to have the first perpetual adoration chapel in the Diocese of Crookston. To make this dream a reality, we need 2 parishioners to cover each of the 168 hours of the week.

As we begin to build the perpetual adoration schedule, the Adoration Society invites you to experience Eucharistic Adoration on Tuesday and Thursdays from 8:30 AM to 10 PM in the Church. Adoration is time to encounter Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament in a profoundly deep and intimate way, which builders a deeper personal relationship with the Lord.

If you have never been to Adoration before, see the bulletin insert for some tips for making a Holy Hour (an hour spent before Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament). Please be sure to use good etiquette and respect for others during Adoration by observing a few points of courtesy: place phones and other devices on silent, refrain from answering calls in the Church, pray silently to avoid disturbing the prayers of other adorers, and keep conversations to the Gathering Space at a low volume.

#### LITURGICAL VESTMENTS

#### The Chasuble

The chasuble is the outer garment and most recognizable garment the priest wears. It is reserved exclusively to the priest. Typically a cross will be embroidered on the chasuble, but other images, especially on chasubles worn on Marian feasts, may be used. The color of the chasuble matches the liturgical color of the day (green, red, white, violet, rose, or black). There are multiple layers of symbology associate with the chasuble. It can represent the yoke of Christ, which is specifically referenced in the vesting prayer: "O Lord, who hast said, 'My yoke is sweet and my burden light,' grant that I may so carry it as to merit Thy grace." The chasuble also symbolizes the cloak worn by Christ as he stood before Pontius Pilate. Lastly it is a symbol of charity, worn over the stole (a symbol of authority), reminding the priest that authority must always be exercised in charity.





In today's Gospel John the Baptist says, "I am the voice of one crying in the desert; make straight the way of the Lord." Let us ask for the grace to help others to know the love of the Lord.





# SAINT BERNARD'S ADORATION SOCIETY INVITES YOU TO SPEND AN HOUR WITH JESUS

### Making a Holy Hour

What is a Holy Hour? A Holy Hour is an hour spent in Adoration of Jesus, present Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity in the Eucharist. If you've never spent an hour in Eucharistic Adoration you might wonder what to do during Adoration. There are as many methods of making a Holy Hour as there are Catholics because each of us has a unique and personal way of relating to our Lord. Here is one way that you could make a Holy Hour that you might find helpful if this is new to you:

- 1. Begin by asking the Holy Spirit to help you enter in this time by increasing the virtues of faith, hope, and love in your heart.
- 2. Adore Jesus. Look at him in the monstrance (the big gold cross displaying the Sacrament). Consider how awesome and majestic the God of the universe is.
- 3. Examine your conscience by reviewing the ten commandments and the precepts of the Church. Consider God's immense love for you and repent of your sins. Offer prayers for the conversion of the world.
- 4. Meditate and contemplate God's action. Read Scripture, perhaps the Mass readings of the day, or pray a Rosary or the Stations of the Cross. Read and reflect on spiritual readings.
- 5. Give thanks. Thank God for all the gifts he has given you and continues to give you.
- 6. Make petitions. Humbly bring your needs and the needs of those around you to God.
- 7. End with a resolution to act on the insights you received during the Holy Hour or to live your baptismal vows more faithfully.

### **Adoration Etiquette**

Many times you will not be the only person in Adoration. It's important to be respectful of other adorers. We might not realize that how we pray when we are alone is not always the best way to pray with others in Eucharistic Adoration.

- Set phones and other devices to silent.
- Refrain from answering phone and video calls in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament.
- Pray silently to avoid disturbing the prayers of the other adorers.
- Keep conversations in the Gathering Space, and at a low volume.
- Reverence is always key: the Eucharist is no ordinary bread, it is Jesus Christ.

#### Eucharistic Adoration at St. Bernard's

The St. Bernard's Adoration Society invites you to Eucharistic Adoration!

St. Bernard's currently has 23 hours of Eucharistic Adoration scheduled each week from 8:30 AM (following daily Mass) to 10:00PM every Tuesday and Thursday. Additional Eucharistic Adoration is scheduled beginning at 7PM on the Friday before the first Saturday each month and ending before the 8:30 AM First Saturday Mass. On Lenten Fridays, Adoration is scheduled following the school Mass and ending at 10:00PM

Adoration currently takes place in the Church, but will move to the Adoration Chapel when the new construction is completed at Easter.

St. Bernard's is working on establishing Perpetual Adoration, meaning there will be Eucharistic Adoration 24 hours a day, every day of the week. In order to accomplish this we need 2 volunteers for each of the 168 hours of the week. Starting this weekend, you will be able to commit to an hour of Eucharistic Adoration on the **We Adore Him** app.

When 12 consecutive hours either between 10AM and 10PM or 10PM and 10AM have at least 1 adorer scheduled, Eucharistic Adoration will begin.
