Greetings,

LENT

Lent is arriving! I hope that you are able to join in the active life of the parish during this season. The fish fry (back in-person as well!) offers great opportunities for service and fellowship on Fridays. Wednesdays we have a great prayer routine with confessions, Mass, Stations of the Cross, and a great group study on prayer. Each year, we ought to think about ways to focus on prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. The point of these practices is to help us grow in holiness. So, choose items which will help make you holy. Are you attached to something bad or attached too much to something good – think about countering that through fasting from it. Are you spending too much on yourself? Try to counter that by giving generously to some good cause. Do you think you should grow in prayer? Commit to a new prayer routine, and really commit to it! Let's all find ways to grow in holiness this year. The Saints always recommend that the best thing to 'give up' during Lent is sin.

SCHOOL

When Bishop Cozzens was here a few weeks ago and we met with parishioners, I mentioned that St. Bernard's School exists first and foremost for parishioners. 

LITURGICAL ITEMS


Chalice Items: The Chalice Veil

The chalice veil is the most prominent item in regards to the Chalice for most of the Mass. It is a rectangular linen that is draped over the Chalice, supported by the pall. The color of the veil matches the liturgical color of the day, and matches the color of the priest's chasuble. In fact, some priests have vestments that having a matching veil (meaning it is more than the same color, but the same embroidery and design).

In many religions, veiling persons and things denotes a sense of sacredness, of being set aside for God. This is especially true in Catholicism. Using the veil over the Chalice denotes that these sacred vessels are set aside for God to be used during the liturgy, meaning the Chalice is only to be used for Mass, not for the priest's morning coffee. The symbolism of the chalice veil goes deeper than that, though. Throughout the first parts of the Mass, the Chalice is present, but hidden, it is mysterious. During the Offertory, the veil is removed from the Chalice and the mystery of salvation is revealed to the congregation. Everything in Mass to this point leads up to this sacrifice which is about to unfold.

The Chalice also represents Christ, especially his Sacred Heart. The one all-sufficient sacrifice of Calvary is represented and made present to us at each Mass. Removing the veil from the Chalice represents, then, when our Lord was stripped of his clothing before being crucified. He became poor and exposed for the sake of the poor and vulnerable, just as he does in the Blessed Sacrament.

Next time you are at Mass take a moment to reflect on the moment the veil is removed and the mysteries of your salvation are revealed on the altar.


Jules Breton, Procession of the Blessed Sacrament, 1857

The priest showed no devotion towards the Blessed Sacrament, so much so that one day after celebrating Mass he took the remaining consecrated Hosts and threw them in the river. Some months later the Hosts were found again, floating in the water and stained with Blood.












Reformation, Catholics silently continued to keep alive the memory of the miracle. Devotion was restored in the twentieth century and there are numerous public events to commemorate the miracle.



crated Hosts left over from Mass into the canal.

Several months later, some fisherman found the Hosts floating in the water and soaked in coagulated Blood. News of the miraculous recovery of the Hosts spread quickly, and immediately many pilgrims came to see. Devotion was approved by the bishop and, though it was banned for a long period during the Protestant


