

### St. Bernard's Adoration Society



## LITURGICAL ITEMS

#### Sanctuary: The Tabernacle

After the altar, the tabernacle is the primary and most distinctive fixture of every Catholic Church. The tabernacle is a cabinet or box, usually made of gold, the purpose of which is to keep undistributed Hosts after Communion. Its shape and size varies from the very simple, to the extremely ornate. There is often a red lamp in the vicinity of the tabernacle, reminding the Faithful that the Lord is truly present.

After the first Pentecost, when celebrating Mass, the first Christians knew that they could not simply dispose of leftover Eucharistic bread because it wasn't bread, it was the actual Body of Christ. During this early period, Christians were persecuted and did not have church buildings, so any Eucharist remaining after Mass was distributed amongst the Faithful to be carried to the sick and home-bound where it would be consumed.

After Christianity was legalized, churches were erected and tabernacles began to be used to hold what remained of the Blessed Sacrament after Mass. The earliest examples were often shaped like gold doves within suspended over the altar. By the Middle Ages various methods of reserving the Blessed Sacrament had developed: cabinets in the sacristy, cupboards or towers in the wall of the sanctuary, in doves or pyxes hanging over the altar, upon the altar itself in a pyx, or in small cupboards arranged in the reredos (the large decorative altar piece standing behind the altar). During the 17th century, more specific guidelines were laid down regarding tabernacles and they began to resemble what are found in Catholic churches today.

While the original intention of the tabernacle was to reserve the Blessed Sacrament for the sick, as the Church's understanding and appreciation of the Real Presence deepened, they became places for silent contemplation and adoration of the Lord in the Eucharist. For this reason, the Catechism states that tabernacles should be located in a worthy place in the church and constructed in such a way as to emphasize and manifest the truth of the Real Presence.

With the exception of the time between Holy Thursday and the Easter Vigil, when the tabernacle is empty, the Lord is always present in the tabernacle, and so Catholics who are able to should genuflect every time they pass the tabernacle as a sign of honor to Christ the King.


