From Fr. Vasek

Greetings,

Please read the included update letter regarding our building project, strategic plan, and property purchase. There is an invitation to join me after Mass next weekend to receive updates and for you to provide feedback or ask any questions you like.

As mentioned before, I am gone many of the weekdays this month. This week (Mon-Thurs), I join the priests of the Diocese for our annual priest convocation in Bemidii. We will be receiving presentations from Divine Renovation, a group helping parishes move out of ruts (simple maintenance) into a more outward, inviting, evangelization-focused mode of life (mission). All the priests are receiving these presentations, and this method of parish thought is at the center of Bishop Cozzens' plan for the future of the Diocese. A way I have been speaking of this since I arrived is that we have about 500 people coming to Mass on any given weekend. However, there are 13,000 people in our area. What needs to happen so that those 13,000 have a clear invitation to live their lives in union with the Christian life of St. Bernard's church? RE: St. Bernard's is Building / Strategic Planning / Rectory

Greetings,

As the new entry nears completion, I write with an update and invitation to gather.

St. Bernard's is Building

On April 18th, I will gather with those who filled the various committees for *St. Bernard's is Building* (SBIB). Much has happened from 2017 until 2024; some committees met for a time, some committees ran their course, and some committees simplified down to a few key volunteers who have carried much of the project's weight over the past years. Since I arrived in July, there has been a standing bi-weekly construction meeting with architects, contractors, workers, and key delegates on behalf of St. Bernard's. I want to thank those who assisted with what has come to be known as *SBIB 1A*. I welcome hearing from them about their experience from 2017-2024, give an update regarding where we are now and what comes next.

On April 20th and 21st, after the Masses, I want to give the same update to the whole parish regarding where we have been, where we are now, and what comes next. Please plan to stay after Mass to spend time together.

National Advisory Council (Strategic Planning)

As I mentioned in my previous letter to the parish (Jan 26th), we will be making use of a *National Advisory Council* (NAC) this year to plan for the future. What is this? In short, it is us. We will bring together delegates from the parish, finance council, pastoral council, faith formation committee, school advisory council, parish and school staff, as well as those who may have moved away (hence the term 'national'), such as alumni, parents of alumni, at-large parishioners, many of whom still have much to contribute to our future. The chairpersons for this will be selected this Spring, consultations with the full parish will take place during the summer, and the formal meeting for the NAC will be this Fall. It will at that Fall gathering that full plans emerge for the future of our parish, school, and building project.

Rectory Purchase

It is my joy to share with you a happy development. I mentioned in the Jan 26th letter that I came to St. Bernard's knowing that a different rectory would need to be in place. The singlelargest hesitation for the building project were responses from parishioners that there wasn't going to be an on-site rectory for the priest. God has blessed us. The property immediately across the street, known to many as "the former convent," has become available to serve as the next rectory of St. Bernard's. This allows for the building project to continue and for the priest to remain 'on-site'. We've studied the property: it's in great structural shape, and, even though it is a bit smaller than the current rectory, the house will be ample enough for our current needs. It allows the priest some privacy as well as immediate proximity to the parish. We've been working quietly on the rectory purchase for a few months, speaking internally with the finance council, pastoral council, and the buildings and grounds committee, to make sure we would move forward with the purchase. I've been working with our advancement director, Charlie Vogel, to fundraise the necessary \$150,000 to purchase the rectory. I am aware that the word has started to get out about the purchase, so it seems best to let you know where it stands at present. A purchase agreement is being signed and the 'former convent' will be purchased as the next rectory. We have about \$100,000 of the needed \$150,000 pledged or in hand already.

The *location* and the *timing* couldn't have been better. The *location* is perfect because it allows St. Bernard's to expand its physical campus, otherwise land-locked, with the priest 'on-site'. The *timing* is perfect because the parish and school are in need of space. It is often the case that Bible study groups, committees, or others have difficulty finding places to meet on site. Having the priest out of the current rectory opens up the quite large space (2 stories and basement) to parish meetings, staff offices, or school use, until the building project continues.

I will also want to share with you our increasing school enrollment trends and projections, more about the structure of the NAC, and how you can be involved going forward. I look forward to being with you, to share where we are, to hear from you, and to continue building up the Body of Christ in Pennington County.
