

"Though the just fall seven times, they rise again..." // Proverbs 24:16

A component of our fallen human nature is to rebel against God and His ways. We have an attraction toward sin—called concupiscence—and you are likely aware of all the grace and effort that are involved in living a life of holiness in spite of that. Even if our hearts are devoted to the Lord and truly desire to live this life with Him, we still fail and fall. We make messy and mighty mistakes. We choose something other than Him.

Blessedly, we are gifted the Sacrament of Confession to which we can run every time we need God's mercy and absolution. But sometimes we struggle to forgive ourselves for our errors. Even after making a thorough Confession and completing our penance, even after doing our best to right the wrong, we can still struggle with disappointment in ourselves. This breeds a lack of peace in our hearts and, at worst, dilutes our trust in the merciful love of Jesus.

Leaves you the choice to accept His forgiveness // If you have made a good Confession and completed your penance, you are fully forgiven! The Lord does not want to leave us in sin, guilt, or shame. He is eager to forgive us and offer us His grace. But He grants us free will, which means we also get to choose whether or not we accept that forgiveness. Jesus wants us to accept His mercy and live in His forgiveness. Let's not deprive Him of that... let's choose to let His forgiveness seep into every crevice of our souls!

Remains with you in the trial // The Lord is aware of your battle with sin or shame. If you are still struggling with past regrets, He knows. If you are still struggling with a sin you've brought to Confession one hundred times, He knows. He sees how it all weighs on your heart and the discouragement you fight. And He is in it all with you. He does not wait until you are "perfect" to accompany you through a trial. He does not withhold His grace from a soul battling to remain in the state of grace. He is not waiting for you to "get over it" before having a good plan for your life in His redemption. It's already been promised to you.

Doesn't want you to stay stuck // It is not the Lord's will that we remain stuck in guilt and shame over confessed sin. He has a plan for our lives, a mission for us to fulfill, an adventure to have with Him. If we cling to our disappointment in ourselves we allow the enemy to win, because then we don't walk forward with Christ. We remain stagnant with ourselves. So when you're tempted to believe that you must punish yourself more for your failings, remember that the Lord is calling you to pick up your mat and move forward.

YOUTH NEWS

The interaction between the Sadducees and Jesus in this week's Gospel reads like something that would happen on social media today. The Sadducees pretend to respect Jesus, addressing him as "teacher," but their real purpose is to trip him up and embarrass him with a trick question. They've already come to their own conclusions and aren't interested in genuine dialogue. What do we do when we encounter this attitude? It can be intensely frustrating to have a conversation on important things turned into a kind of competition, and it is all too common. The temptation is to respond the same way, leaving us hunting for devastating comebacks until the conversation devolves entirely into one attempted smackdown after another.

Jesus doesn't fall into this trap. Instead of attacking the Sadducees' belief in the Law of Moses, he shows them how belief in the resurrection is compatible with the Law. How can we use our faith to help guide our response to people?

Take Action: During the month of November, we pray in a special way for the dead, asking for the intercession of the saints in heaven and praying for the souls in purgatory. You can participate in the traditions associated with the feast of All Souls by visiting a cemetery. Ask God to bring all souls to himself, and don't forget to ask the dead to pray for you, too! Just like we can ask our friends on earth to pray for us, we can ask the saints for their prayers as well since we believe they are living in heaven with God.
