



Behold, now is the acceptable time; Behold, now is the day of Salvation. 2 Corinthians 6:2

We have all had the experience of knowing that we need to do something about a situation and yet putting it off until another day. It's incredible to witness the lengths to which we will go in order to procrastinate or deflect, somehow hoping the situation will diffuse itself or that we won't have to face it!

Certainly there is a time for all things, and fear and compulsion are not ideal motives for change, but I believe we all have places deep within our hearts where the Lord is saying to us, "It's time now. Let's look at these things together. I am with you. You are never alone. It is time to allow these places to surface so you can be well."

Perhaps even reading those words triggers anxiety in your heart or tension in your stomach. Jesus is with you. He leads you into these places, little by little.

This is why prayer and encounter from the heart is so important. When people love each other, they can talk about anything. It may not be easy, and it may take time, but the truth can come out and be seen and experienced by the witness of love. It is the bond of authentic and everlasting love (covenant) that allows for the freedom for everything to come out upon the altar of our hearts with God. Jesus will not reject us.

Today, as you read this, is a very acceptable time.

Reflect

What is one thing the Lord is inviting you to place upon the altar of your heart today?

Pray

Lord, give me the courage to be honest about my heart, knowing you know everything and you are with me to lead me and guide me. Amen.

We can scoff at the disciples for assuming blindness was a punishment for sin, but are we all that different? Victim blaming is rampant in our culture: suffering comes from doing something wrong. We want to believe we can avoid suffering by making the right choices. The contrast between the blind man and the Pharisees reminds us that there are worse evils than pain and worse deprivations than loneliness. After his sight is restored, the once-blind man finds himself socially outcast for his faith in Christ. His testimony doesn't fit into the narrative the Pharisees have constructed to protect their own comfortable lives and beliefs. Even then, the newly sighted man remains grateful and worships Jesus. His physical blindness prepared the blind man to recognize the healing Christ came to offer; the Pharisee's selfishness and spiritual blindness prevented them from seeing what was happening right in front of them. Which is the greater deprivation?

In his book *Man's Search for Meaning*, Austrian psychiatrist and Holocaust survivor Viktor Frankl writes about the distinction between suffering and sacrifice. One way many Christians give meaning to suffering is by "offering it up" in prayer. Though the phrase can be overused, its deep meaning is to ask Jesus to turn our suffering into a source of spiritual graces or healing for others. This week, when you encounter hardship, practice offering it up to Jesus as a sacrifice for a person or cause you care about.





Fourth Sunday of Lent: Jesus Heals



THE GRACE I SEEK: to believe that Jesus longs to bring me healing and strength

IN THE NAME OF THE FATHER, AND OF THE SON, AND OF THE HOLY SPIRIT. AMEN.

Jesus, the Lord of Life, has given himself to you in the Eucharist. He is gazing upon you, his beloved child, with great love at this very moment. Pause for a few moments and wonder at his gift for you. Allow yourself to rest in his loving gaze.

Thank Jesus for the gift of himself in the Eucharist.

ASK FOR THE GRACE: Jesus, help me to believe you are longing to transform my life with your healing.

SCRIPTURE MEDITATION — Read slowly, 3-4 times. Allow the words of Scripture to wash over your mind and heart. Allow the Holy Spirit to speak to you through this passage.

"Not as man sees does God see, because man sees the appearance, but the LORD looks into the heart' [...] Then Samuel, with the horn of oil in hand, anointed David in the presence of his brothers; and from that day on, the spirit of the LORD rushed upon David." (1 Samuel 16:7b, 13a)

REFLECTION QUESTION — Allow yourself to sit with these questions for a while, being attentive to how the Lord is speaking in your heart.

Knowing that Jesus sees into the recesses of the heart, where in your heart is Christ's healing needed the most? Is there a place in your heart where you have never allowed the Lord to go? Ask Jesus for the grace to allow his spirit to "rush" upon that place to heal any wounds or sickness hidden there.

SCRIPTURE MEDITATION — Read slowly, 3-4 times. Again, allow the words of Scripture to wash over your mind and heart. Let the Holy Spirit speak to you through this passage.

"They brought the one who was once blind to the Pharisees. [...] So then the Pharisees also asked him how he was able to see. He said to them, 'He put clay on my eyes, and I washed, and now I can see.'" (John 9:13, 15)

REFLECTION QUESTION — Allow yourself to sit with these questions for a while, being attentive to how the Lord is speaking in your heart.

Jesus, the Good Physician, knows our weaknesses of body, heart, and mind. He longs to heal us in ways we cannot imagine. Gazing upon the Eucharist, ask Jesus to help you "see" his providential care. Ask for the eyes to recognize his healing presence in your life, and thank him for this healing.

Remain in silence with the Lord. Allow him to speak in the silence, in your heart. Receive his presence. If it helps, write down what you sense the Lord communicating to you during this time of prayer.

CLOSING PRAYER — O God, who through your Word reconcile the human race to yourself in a wonderful way, grant, we pray, that with prompt devotion and eager faith the Christian people may hasten toward the solemn celebrations to come. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. (Collect, Fourth Sunday of Lent)

SUNDAY MASS CONNECTION — At every Mass, Jesus offers himself to the Father for us. We can always join our own offerings with Jesus at Mass. This Sunday, offer your desire for spiritual healing.
